Create some music/make an instrument using junk and plan a procession around your home.





Compare some mini beasts you might find in the Amazon with some that you have found in your garden. What is the same and what is different?




Memory game- Turn over these cards. How many can you remember? Challenge a grown up. Can you beat them? Twinkl sheet or draw your own pictures of different sports.



Read- The Hare and the Tortoise. Or listen on YOUTUBE. Talk to the children about the moral of the story.


Play ping pong (verbally rally)

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Writing- write 5 rules for your favourite sport.


Or

Try and learn a new fact about each animal.







Read and enjoy.



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
Learn a new song from the Jungle Book. Can you make up a dance to it? My favourite is the Bare Necessities.
